Retired Jan. 4, 1982
Died Dec. 9, 2008



As most of you already know, Ann passed away December 9th from complications from her heart condition at Santa Teresa Hospital.

Ann began her career with the San Jose Police Department on July 15, 1960. People that know Ann knew that she didn't get the recognition she deserved while in this position. While in the detective bureau, her supervisor didn't want to pursue a case, so she did on her own time. She effectively solved a murder case in LA and her supervisor took the credit. In the many-many hours that I've spent with Ann, this is only one of the cases that she told me about where she should have received recognition. But she was only an APW (Assistant Police Woman). Ann and the other APW's filed a Federal lawsuit for full status and in 1979 was reclassified as a Police Officer. She retired from San Jose in 1982.

Ann joined the IPA so long ago that I can't find the date. She became a local officer and even held a position in the National IPA. She was the Secretary/Treasurer for many years until her heart problems required that she stop. As you all know, two years ago, Ann required surgery and was in a comma for 3 months and in the hospital for 4 months. After months of recuperation, Ann made an amazing recovery and I thought about asking her to take her old job back. But her husband Mac had health problems and I figured that would be unfair.

Ann and Mac were married for 62 years and until three years ago, they hosted the Annual BBQ at their home. They met during WWII while Mac was in the Army and stationed not too far from Ann's family ranch. For her it was love right away. They belonged together. And for those of you who came to the brunches, they were inseparable. When I asked people if they were interested in sponsoring a child in a Kenyan orphanage,

Ann and Mac were the first to step up. They are sponsoring a young Maasai named Rose.

I have collected some e-mails sent by IPA members when they found out that she had passed.

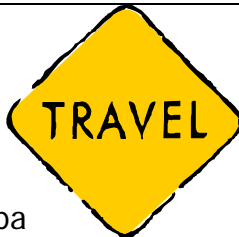

After she had recovered, I took her down first to pick-up her badge, then for the ID. When we got to the admin building, we waited in line for about 20 minutes with Ann leaning on her walker with oxygen. Two people let her cut ahead since it was obvious that Ann was in distress. When we got up to the counter, a female officer asked her why she had a badge and she answered, "because I worked here and have the right". When she asked again, I said "Because she was a police officer and has the right to carry her badge". Then I showed her mine. After another ten minutes, she let us in for the photo. What I really wanted to say was, "You have your job because of women like her".



The second photo was taken on the last BB-Q that was hosted by Ann and Mac at their home.

Ann was a formidable woman. She was passionate and a perfectionist. And she expected the same of everyone else. She has left a huge footprint on this earth and I will really miss her. I'm not the only one. Over two hundred people came to her memorial. Who will call me now to tell me that I misspelled a word in the Newsletter.

Nine By-Law Proposals

#1: **Passed**: Opens the membership to others involved in law enforcement. (i.e. retired and active involved in the prevention, detection, investigation and prosecution and/or incarceration of any person who violates the law).

#2 and #4B were **withdrawn**.

#3: **Failed**

#4A: **Amended** to have any person represent as the delegate.

#5: Electronic Voting **Passed**

#6: **Passed** staggered Region officer voting

#7: **Passed** personal information on members not to be released except under certain circumstances.

#8A and #8B: **Passed** spouses of deceased members to hold same ID #.

It was also voted the IPA USA Section will no longer use the travel site as listed on the website and is being replaced with "FORCE CLUB" which will not only offer discounts for travel but also everyday items. They will design our new annual IPA card and that card is what you will use to obtain the discounts. The card must be present to merchants for the discounts.
